9 **Section 1**. W.S. 1-1-139 is created to read:

14 (a) As used in this section:

2	(i) "Business entity" means a corporation,
3	association, partnership, trust, joint venture, limited
4	liability company, limited liability partnership, political
5	subdivision or other body of government, hospital, long-
6	term care facility or other legal business entity and shall
7	include both for profit and nonprofit entities. For
8	purposes of this section, "business entity" shall include
9	employees and agents of the business entity while the
10	employee or agent is acting within the scope of his
11	employment;

13	(ii) "Coronavirus" means:

15	(A) Severe acute respiratory syndrome
16	coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) or the disease caused by severe

- 10 entity if the injury from actual or perceived exposure to

- 15 Section 2. This act shall apply to actions and
- 16 omissions and injuries from actual or perceived exposure to
- 17 coronavirus that occur on or after the effective date of

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
